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
Design & Technology – Key Stage 2

Block Bots

New Year 5 and 6 groups have been introduced to the DT workshop and learning to be safe using tools and equipment. They have designed ideas, generated design criteria and used a range of hand tools to make these fantastic Block Bots.









Mechanisms: Linkages

Can early learning be fun?

We have also been learning about mechanisms and how they can be applied in different scenarios. Pupils explored linkages and designed an alphabet page for young children.













Textiles & Sustainability

What can you do with unwanted textiles?

These are some of the triangular juggling balls that have been made from donated textiles. Pupils used colour theory for fabric choices, learned about sewing inside out using a seam allowance and practised running stitch, back stitch and blanket stitch.





Design & Technology – Key Stage 3

Introduction to CAD/CAM

Year 7 and 8 have been gaining confidence using CAD, Computer Aided Design, using 2D software to design a personalised keyring. We used CAM, Computer Aided Manufacture, to make them using the laser cutter.






Year 7 Desk Tidy

Pupils have used design to solve the problem of organisation and storage. They combined CAD/CAM with using hand and machine tools to construct these creative desk tidies. They designed and cut their own profile shape, made a dowel joint and used the strip heater to bend the plastic back.







Year 8 Electronics: Mood Light

Pupils used their CAD skills from making the keyring to design a mood light topper inspired by an Art Movement. They learned how to solder components to a PCB and how to construct a strong base to house the circuit.



Sustainability: The 6Rs

Pupils learned about what is a product life cycle and its impact on the environment. In one lesson, Year 8 pupils designed and made these brilliant memo clip holders using wood off-cuts from projects this year. Great work Year 8.

We are excited to share a fantastic selection of new artworks created by our imaginative and creative students

Recycling and Sustainability

Year 6 and 7 students have been learning all about sustainability in Art.

We've discussed the many ways that art can be created using recycled and sustainable materials, as well as address topics of climate change, waste and social issues.

We are creating mixed media fish collages which will become part of a large collaborative artwork communicating the importance of protecting our oceans and sea life.



Year 5

ZENTANGLE BUTTERFLIES

Students enjoyed exploring a wide variety of watercolour application techniques. We experimented with 'wet on wet', wax crayon resist and crystallising effects using salt.









Year 6

MARK-MAKING TEXTURE CUBES

Students used their artist research skills to analyse then recreate Van Gogh inspired mark-making. They used this to decorate and then build their texture cube from the net of a shape.

CITYSCAPE CLAY TILES

Taking inspiration from artist Paul Klee, students designed and sculpted a unique city scape design. We spent time reflecting on our knowledge of colour theory to bring these designs to life.

CHRIS RYNIAK CLAY MONSTERS

Developing ideas through artist research, collage experimentation and sketchbook designs enabled students to create a brilliant bunch of unique and animated characters.



Year 8

DECONSTRUCTED PORTRAITS

Using inspiration from artist Louis Jover, students created a mixed media artwork exploring the life and work of a famous artist.

We included a variety of techniques such as oil pastel mono printing, watercolour blending and pattern illustration.

This year Sports Day is on Wednesday 3rd July 2024.
